

'Simpler Recycling' guide for England



Residual waste frequency <u>no less than fortnightly from March 2026</u>
All dry recycling (exc Plastic films) from March 2026. Films from March 2027.

Separate food waste from March 2026 unless transitional arrangements apply.

Garden waste collections from March 2026

Businesses (excl. micro firms)

All dry recycling by March 2025 excl. plastic films. Plastic films from March 2027.

Separate food waste collections from March 2025 (no minimum frequency)

Micro-firms (less than 10 FTE per enterprise not location)

Dry recycling by March 2027 incl. plastic films which are also required from March 2027

Separate food waste from March 2027 (no Minimum frequency)


DRS – Deposit return scheme pEPR – Packaging Extended producer Responsibility ETS – Emission trading scheme

Materials required to be collected

- Glass, including bottles and jars
- · Metal steel and Al cans, aerosols, Al foil & food trays, jars, bottle lids & tubes
- Plastic PET, PP &HDPE bottles, PET, PP (linc expanded PP) and PE Pots tubs and trays, PE & PP tubes larger than 50mmx50mm, Cartons for food, drink & other liquids, Plastic films & bags (from March 2027) Mono PE, PP & mixed PE & PP = including metallised through vacuum or vapour deposition.
- ALL paper & card, except that which contains glitter or foil, is laminated, is sticky backed, padded lined envelopes, paper & hard back books and wallpaper.
- Food waste separately collected from March 2026









2042 waste reduction target - Component construct by waste stream or activity

And customers are different in different regions





- tonnes by fossil content by carbon price






Example EFW costs for ETS – 250ktpa facility – monthly variations

Variation shows variation by month by tonnes, availability, price and composition


£30/t CO2e - 50% Biogenic

The UK ETS price is volatile

The Price drop has been partially driven by the UK Government releasing allowances to mitigate the power price rise due to the war in Ukraine,


Target prices for UK ETS are ~£150/t by 2035 and they are not proposing to bring us in with our full sector allowance (Not 10Mt, possibly 7Mt, CCC recommendation 0Mt).


Constraint on allowances increases demand and price
